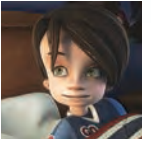

Alex and the Ghosts

Animation about a boy who dreams of going to a hockey game with his father to see his favorite team, the Montreal Canadiens, play.



The Great Race

A genuine sprint race between a man and his one-eyed cat. Film played at the Cannes Film Festival and Midge became the most famous cat in Britain.

El Salón México

Collaboration between Academy Award winner Paul Glickman and teen graphic artist/ animator, Tamarind King. Fantasy set in Mexico in the 1800's to the music of Aaron Copland. Best Animation, Rome and Independents Film Festivals.



The Girl Who Cried Flowers

First animated film created with Aurny's watercolor system; adapted from a Jane Yolen fairytale. A girl in ancient Greece cries blossoms instead of tears. Gold Award, KIDS FIRST! Best winner, International Family Film Festival.



Parental Control

Set in a suburban British town, a comedy about a mischievous young boy who tries to control his parents via a computer.

Grandfather's Journey

Through memories of his grandfather's life in Japan and the US, Caldecott Book Award winner Allen Say recounts his family's journey to America. Narrated by B. D. Wong.



Alba (Dawn)

From Italy, the story of a child who fights an illness by imagining he is a knight combating an evil dragon. Live action and animation. Gold Award, KIDS FIRST! Best; winner, FirstGlance and Monaco Film Festivals.



Legend of Ol' Goldie

A modern fairytale from the UK. When a lonely boy catches a goldfish in the lake, no one is prepared for what lies within. Who says you can't be friends with a giant goldfish?! Silver KIDS FIRST! Best Award.



Paws and Whiskers

Eleven-year-old Katie Hoffman's documentary about an Animal Rescue Fund in Long Island, N.Y. Highlights adorable animals and "love matches" between people and pets. Winner, Best Documentary: Junior Division at CineYouth! Chicago Festival.

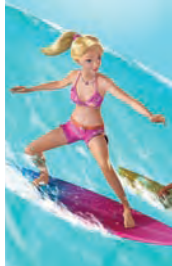
Plastic Perils of the Pacific

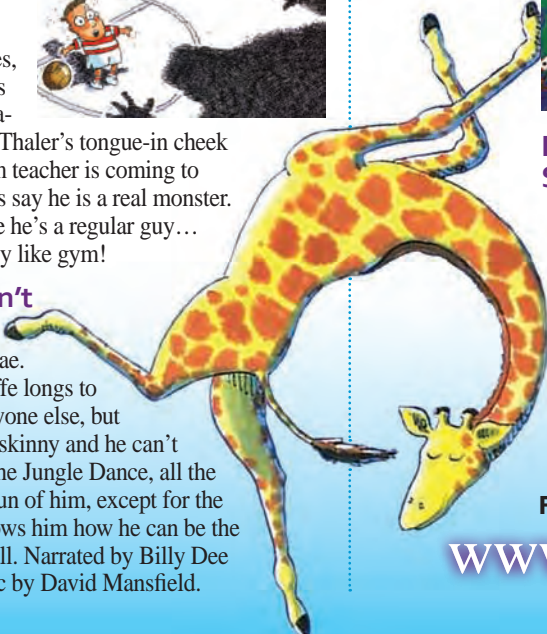
The Gym Teacher from the Black Lagoon
